Library History

The Tuckahoe Free Library Association was organized in December 1912 by the Woman's Club of Eastchester.

According to the first annual report to the State of New York, the library formally opened July 21, 1913. In an account of the December 20, 1962 Eastchester Record, the dedication year was 1912. The library was housed in three rooms in the Village Hall; rent, light, heat and janitor service were free. According to the first annual report, as of June 30, 1913, the library contained 380 books for adults and 88 for children. Any resident of the Town of Eastchester or of the adjacent territory of Crestwood and the tenth Ward, Yonkers, over 12 years of age could participate in the privileges of the library, free. Membership in the Association was \$1.00 per year.

Members were entitled to vote for Trustees.

The library was converted from Association status to a free public library by charter of the Regents of the University of the State of New York, June 30, 1927. It then became part of the Village government. Date unknown, the library was moved to the first floor of the Village Hall, Depot Square. There was one large open room for reading, book stacks and reader-service desk. A small work room, storage area and office at the rear of building contained about 150 square feet. Total library was 2,685 square feet. The library was moved to a new facility, first floor of the Tuckahoe Community Center, Columbus Avenue, August 1979. An activity room, staff kitchen, work room, service room, storage closet, public area with seating for 70, made possible an increase in holdings and library services. Total area of facility is 6,148 square feet.
